# ADAMHS Board Year-in-Review



Greetings,

A year ago as I was writing my address, the Board was celebrating the success of the passage of our local levy, which included a .3 increase. Little did I know that immediately following the close of FY '07 Hancock County would make history as a result of a flood and be declared a federal disaster area. Recovery from the flood which ravished Hancock County in August of 2007 and

again in February 2008 has been front and center for the Board and our providers throughout FY '08.

Under the leadership of Century Health, mental health professionals were available at the local shelter around the clock. Staff from Century Health and Family Resource Centers as well as many local volunteers delivered crisis mental health services to hundreds of adults and children. Two federal FEMA grants were awarded to the Board to provide both immediate and long term support to flood survivors. These Board grants were then awarded to Century Health for the coordination and delivery of outreach services, known as Hancock Cares. Door to door outreach was conducted by a team of 6 outreach workers. Together, they contacted over 2,000 homes and businesses impacted by the flood. In addition, they held a support group; sponsored community meetings; and took information on available services to organizations throughout the county.

Our system is to be commended for the response provided by all who work in our contract agencies. The negative emotional impact of the disaster has been lessened as a result of your efforts.

In addition to the flood recovery efforts, our contract agencies, especially Century Health, Family Resource Centers, Focus on Friends and L&M Supportive Housing did their best to meet the ever increasing demand for services each day. Their hard work and dedication is both acknowledged and appreciated.

Finally, I would like to thank all of our volunteer Board members who have faithfully served and provided direction to the staff.

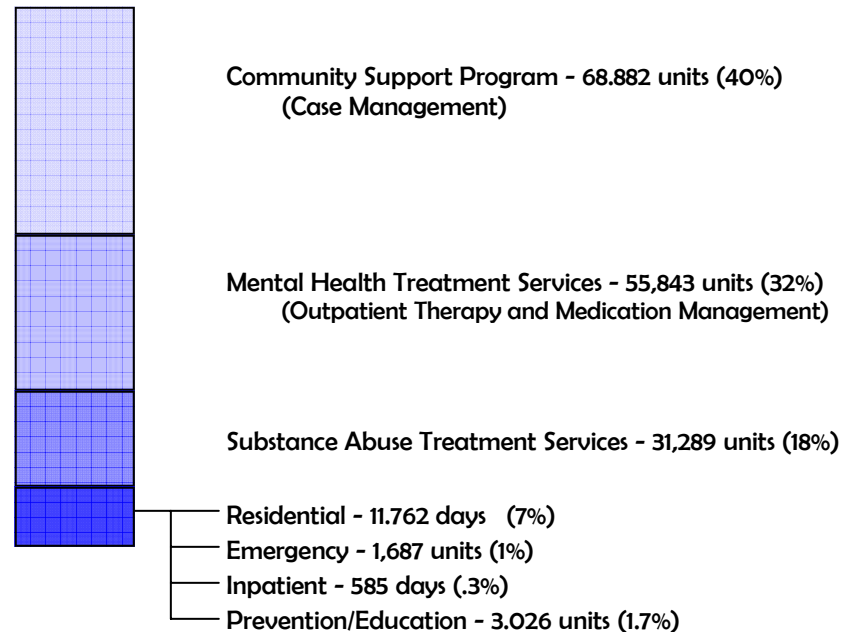
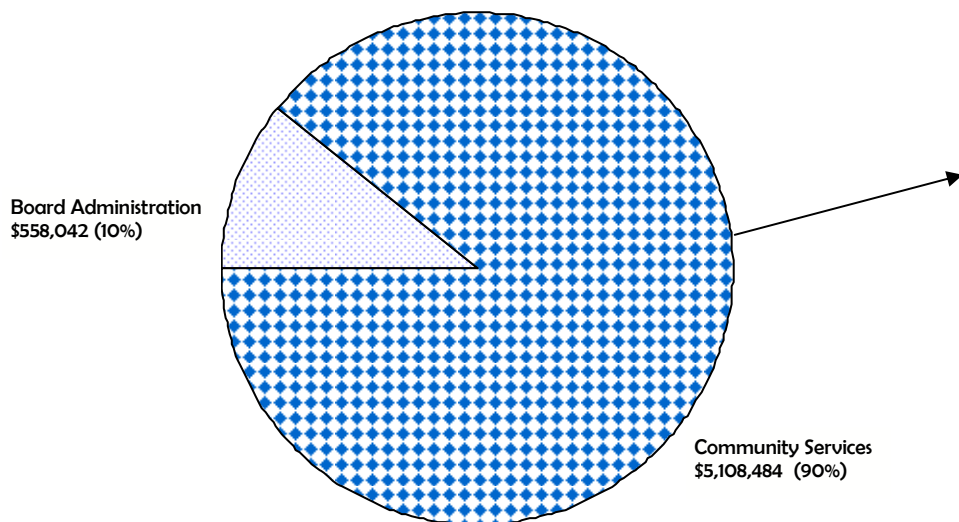

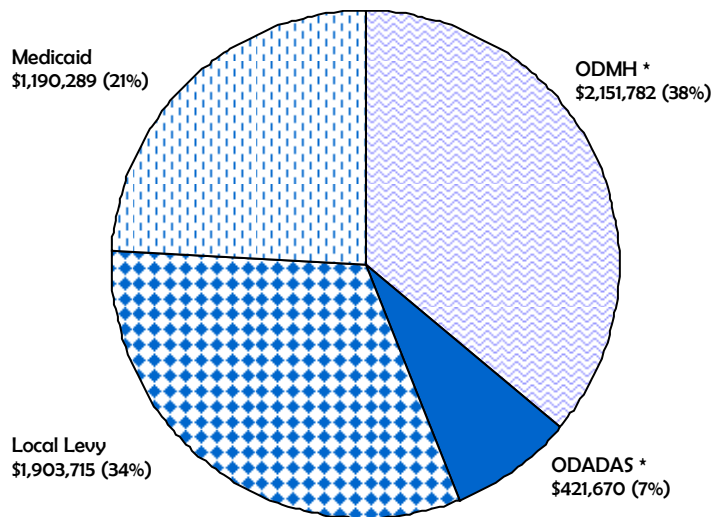
